The Mary Lou Holland Scholarship was established by Mary Lou Holland to assist a graduating Fairmont senior that was also a graduate of Ms. Holland's Beavertown Elementary class. The award is a \$1,000 one-year scholarship and will be given to a student who has a combination of high GPA, is active in the community and school, and shows a financial need.

## **Scholarship Criteria**

- Be a graduating senior from Fairmont High School
- Be a graduate of Beavertown Elementary and have attended Mary Lou Holland's class
- Be accepted at an accredited two or four-year college or university or a two-year technical school\*

## **Application Process**

- Submit a scholarship application with the following attachments:
  - A list of activities as required on the application
  - The completed copy of the Student Aid Report (SAR) summary page from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). THE FAFSA REPORT IS THE **ONLY** ELIGIBLE REPORT, PLEASE DO NOT SUBMIT TAX RETURNS OR W2'S
  - A transcript of grades through the seventh semester
  - A letter or verification of attendance from Beavertown Elementary School
  - One recent letter of recommendation from a teacher, guidance counselor, coach, community or church leader

## **Criteria for selection:**

GPA, community and school activities, and financial need

## **Selection Process:**

The Selection of a recipient will be made by a committee appointed by The Dayton Foundation

## **Size and frequency of the Scholarship:**

One \$1,000 scholarship will be offered annually; however, the Mary Lou Holland Scholarship Selection Committee may elect to change the amount or number of scholarships awarded; or not to award a scholarship if, in its judgment, a suitable candidate cannot be identified.

## **Use of the Scholarship:**

The Mary Lou Holland Scholarship may be used for tuition and related educational expenses.
